

WEST RAYNHAM INFORMATION

The trials venue is on the site of the disused RAF West Raynham airfield. The airfield was built just before WW2 and used as a bomber station for Bristol Blenheims and Douglas Bostons although many different fighter aircraft were stationed there over the years including Mosquitos, Meteors, Venoms, Vampires and Hawker Hunters. In the early 60s the station was converted into a Bloodhound Missile base and continued until closure in 1994.

Most of the airfield buildings still stand including the hangars and the unusual control tower (one of only 4 built).

Obviously the missiles have long since gone and the area is now ideal for our sport. The terrain consists of man made grassy embankments and semi-dismantled concrete ground works.

DIRECTIONS

Entrance to the site is at the rear of the airfield off the road between Weasenham St Peter and Helhoughton in Norfolk.

To find this road drive along the A1065 Swaffham to Fakenham road until you find TJC Landrovers and the Funeral Directors about ¼ mile east of Weasenham St Peter (postcode for your sat nav **PE32 2TF**) and take the road opposite signposted Helhoughton. The entrance is just over a mile down this lane. Watch out for Dabbers signs.
